FRUIT AND VEG WASTE

CAN IT BE COMPOSTED?

MATERIAL: GREEN

CARBON:NITROGEN RATIO 25:1

> TIME TAKEN TO **DECOMPOSE:** 2-5 WEEKS

Don't add cooked vegetables to your compost that have come into contact with meat, dairy or oils.

Fruit and veg leftovers will break down pretty quickly, cut into small chunks to speed it up.





CAN IT BE COMPOSTED?

MATERIAL: GLOSSY PAPER AND INK


TIME TAKEN TO DECOMPOSE: **MORE THAN 1 YEAR**

MATERIAL: PLASTIC WITH CHEMICALS

TIME TAKEN TO DECOMPOSE: IT CAN TAKE 200-**500 YEARS**

CAN IT BE COMPOSTED?



MATERIAL: WATER-**RESISTANT OIL**

> **ADDING IT WILL SLOW DOWN THE** COMPOSTING PROCESS.

You can use left over cooking oils that are solid at room temperature to make bird feeders.

It can attract rodents. form water resistant barriers and reduce air-flow.





CAN IT BE COMPOSTED?

MATERIAL: BROWN

CARBON:NITROGEN **RATIO 100:1**

> TIME TAKEN TO **DECOMPOSE: 2-4 WEEKS**

As long as it hasn't been used to clean up anything that isn't suitable for composting e.g. oil, pet waste
